The Somerset Eel Recovery Project is seeking an enthusiastic Project Manager to run a series of mini projects to help the recovery of the European eel in Somerset.

Qualifications

The position would ideally suit an ecologist or conservation volunteer or professional seeking a short term exciting environmental project.

Role purpose

The Project Co-ordinator will be responsible for managing and delivering a series of mini projects in Somerset, based around the Wedmore area, to deliver some of SERP's 2024 initiatives for the recovery of the European eel.

Key areas of work and relevant tasks

- To co-ordinate the delivery of the 'Eels in the Classroom' project to approx. 50 local schools this is the main project of the SERP 24 program. This is physical work transporting and installing tanks, filling the tanks with water, and then returning to add eels to the tank.
- The collection of water samples for eDNA Monitoring of eel populations
- Organising the making of eel ropes
- Organising the installation of eel ropes on barriers to eel migration
- Liaising with local authorities, agencies, schools, conservation organisations and landowners to gain their support and permissions
- Co-ordinating the work of the wider team and volunteers
- Communicating the work of the projects, via website, social media and local media working alongside our PR person.
- Assist and take part in our Eel Conference 5th July 2024 in Glastonbury.
- Possible involvement in the catch and release of migrating elvers over sea barriers/fishing

Position

The Project Co-ordinator will report to the SERP the team

Hours and status

- This is a 4/5-month temporary contract, it is difficult to be certain about the exact hours, so the use of a timesheet will be helpful, also this project may be repeated in 2025. This is the first time we have rolled out such a comprehensive school program so flexibility is key.
- It could be a be a full-time role at times, but could possibly be managed part time: 3 4 days a week.

- A level or equivalent in relevant subject, e.g. life sciences (essential)
- HND or Degree in relevant subject, e.g. Biology, Ecology, Conservation, Geography (desirable)
- Understanding of natural systems, e.g. water biology, fish biology,

- Ability to communicate with a range of audiences, from professionals, to volunteers, to school children
- Full driving licence and your own insured vehicle.
- Own laptop and mobile
- A cleared CRB or equivalent
